

## Trainers

**Aimilia Markouizou Gica:** With a Primary Education, Teaching English as a Foreign Language, a Psychology and a Psychology of Education background (Master's), she has worked extensively as a trainer with adolescents, parents, teachers and other professionals, both in Greece and abroad on issues concerning Prevention, Early Intervention of Substance Abuse, Psychology, Prevention of Child Accidents, Teaching and Learning, Community Work, Adolescence and Parenting. Through her 20-year clinical experience as a Family Therapist, she brings a multidimensional expertise in her work with individuals and groups, applying the principles of Systemic Theory, Practice and Supervision, Attachment theory, Appreciative Inquiry, Process Work and Social Network Theory and Methodology in diverse contexts (schools, organizations, judicial system, families). She has been trained on and taken part in various European projects and has participated in developing an on-line guide for Teachers, Mental Health Professionals and Parents on Prevention and Early Intervention of Drug Abuse and other Addictive Behaviors.

**Sabrina Paruffa:** she's a teacher and teacher trainer. She is presently teaching English at ITSSE "Odorico Mattiussi" in Pordenone (Italy), an upper secondary school whose courses include Business economics, Law, Computer science, Financial Accounting, Marketing.
